BE IT RESOLVED THAT ARTICLE IX OF THE OCSEA STATE CONSTITUTION BE AMENDED AS FOLLOWS:

1	Article IX – Delegates
2 3	Section 1. OCSEA Convention Delegates
4	(A) Delegates-At-Large
5	(1) Automatic
6	All State Officers, members of the Board of Directors and Chapter, District
7	Council, or Assembly presidents of this Union shall be delegates-at-large to all
8	conventions. In the event that the Chapter, District Council, or Assembly president is
9	unable to attend the convention as the Chapter, District Council, or Assembly's
10	authorized delegate, the vice president shall be the delegate-at-large. In the event that
11	the Chapter, District Council, or Assembly vice president is unable to attend the
12	convention as the Chapter, District Council, or Assembly's authorized delegate, the
13	secretary or secretary/treasurer shall be the delegate-at-large. In the event that the
14	Chapter, District Council, or Assembly secretary or secretary/treasurer is unable to
15	attend the convention as the Chapter, District Council, or Assembly's authorized
16	delegate, the treasurer shall be the delegate-at-large. If the Treasurer is unable to
17	attend, a member of the Executive Board shall be the delegate-at-large based on lot.
18	(2) Succession
19	If a Chapter, District Council, or Assembly President is a delegate-at-large by
20	virtue of another elected position, the Chapter, District Council, or Assembly vice
21	president shall be the delegate-at-large representing the Chapter, District Council or
22	Assembly. If a Chapter, District Council, or Assembly vice-president is unable to
23	attend the convention as the Chapter, District Council Or Assembly's authorized
24	delegate, the secretary or secretary/treasurer shall be the delegate-at-large. In the
25	event that the Chapter, District Council, or Assembly secretary or secretary/treasurer
26	is unable to attend the convention as the Chapter, District Council or Assembly's
27	authorized delegate, the treasurer shall be the delegate-at-large. If the Treasurer is
28	unable to attend, a member of the Executive Board shall be the delegate-at-large
29	based on lot.

31	(B) Other Convention Delegates
32	Each Chapter shall be entitled to at least one delegate and one alternate to the OCSEA
33	biennial convention or any OCSEA special conventions, in addition to the delegate-at-
34 25	large provided in Section 1(A) of this Article. An elected delegate who is unable to attend shall be replaced by an alternate. If the Chapter has alcosed more than one alternate, the
35 36	shall be replaced by an alternate. If the Chapter has elected more than one alternate, the alternate shall be selected in order of the highest to the lowest number of votes received.
30 37	In the event of a tie, the executive board of the affected Chapter, District Council, or
37 38	Assembly shall select one of the tied alternates.

BE IT RESOLVED THAT ARTICLE IX OF THE OCSEA STATE CONSTITUTION BE AMENDED AS FOLLOWS:

39 40 41	(C) Additional Delegates and Alternates A Chapter shall be entitled to one (1) additional delegate and alternate for each one hundred (100) members. Membership for this purpose shall mean the number of active
42	members listed as of 60 days preceding the opening date of any convention.
43	
44	(D) Delegate Qualifications
45	All elected delegates and alternates must be active members of the Union for one (1)
46	continuous year immediately prior to the election.
47	
48	(E) Election of Delegates
49 50	Fifteen (15) days notice must be given prior to the election of delegates and
50	alternates. The election shall be conducted in accordance with OCSEA's election
51 52	procedure pursuant to the OCSEA Subordinate Body Constitution Article VI, at least ten
52 53	(10) days before but not more than one hundred eighty (180) days prior to the start of a convention, and the credentials shall be forwarded immediately by the body's secretary to
55 54	the Secretary-Treasurer of the Union.

56	Section 2. Assembly Delegates
57	(A) Voting delegates to an Assembly shall consist of each Chapter President (if the
58	Chapter President is employed by the agency that forms the Assembly), or his/her designee from
59	the appropriate agency and one other delegate from the appropriate agency elected by the
60	members of the Chapter who are employed by the agency that forms the Assembly.
61	(B) State Board of Directors members, including State Officers, who work in the agency
62	represented by the Assembly shall be voting members of the Assembly.
63	(C) Each of the ODOT District Stewards shall be voting members of the Assembly.
64	(C) (D) The term of office for an Assembly delegate shall be three (3) years. Delegates
65	shall be elected in conjunction with the Chapter's election of officers and executive board
66	members pursuant to Article VI of the Subordinate Body Constitution. A Chapter shall be
67 68	entitled to elect delegates to every Assembly which represents agencies covered by its
68 69	jurisdiction. (D) (E) Delegates to the Assembly may be removed by the Chapter from which they
70	were elected for failure to attend two (2) consecutive meetings of the Assembly without being
70	excused. When an emergency precludes advance notification, the body may retroactively grant
72	an excused absence.

74	Section 3. District Council Delegates
75	(A) Delegates to a council shall consist of each Chapter president or his/ her designee and
76	one other delegate elected by the Chapter.

BE IT RESOLVED THAT ARTICLE IX OF THE OCSEA STATE CONSTITUTION BE AMENDED AS FOLLOWS:

77 (B) State Board of Directors members shall be voting delegates in the District Council 78 from which they were elected. State Officers shall be voting delegates in the District Council to 79 which their home chapter is assigned.

80 (D) The term of office for a District Council delegate shall be three (3) years. Delegates 81 shall be elected in conjunction with the Chapter's election of officers and executive board 82 pursuant to Article VI of the Subordinate Body Constitution.

(E) Delegates to the District Council may be removed by the Chapter from which they 83 84 were elected for failure to attend two (2) consecutive meetings of the District Council without 85 being excused. When an emergency precludes

86 advance notification, the body may retroactively grant an excused absence.

88 **Section 4. International Convention Delegates**

89 (A) The State Board of Directors shall determine the number of delegates to represent the 90 Union at the Biennial Convention or any special convention of the International Union. By virtue 91 of election to their respective positions, the State President, State Vice President, State Secretary-92 Treasurer, State Board of Directors members and the President of each District Council shall be 93 eligible to be delegates to the International Convention.

94 (B) In the event that the State Board of Directors determines that the number of delegates 95 to attend the International Convention is less than the number delineated above, the State Board 96 of Directors shall determine which individuals from those delineated above, shall attend using the following order of priority: State President, State Vice President, State Secretary-Treasurer, 97 98 one (1) Board Member from each of the State Board of Directors Districts and District Council 99 President, selected proportionately, according to the Union membership of their respective

100 districts.

101 (C) Should the number of delegates authorized by the State Board of Directors to attend 102 such International Convention exceed the number of State Officers, Board of Directors members 103 and District Council Presidents attending such International Convention, additional delegates 104 shall be elected from amongst the Districts on a pro-rata membership basis.

105 If a District Council President is a member of the State Board of Directors, or is unable to 106 attend, the International Convention delegate slot shall proceed through the levels of succession 107 in that District as outlined in the State Constitution Article IX, Section 1(A)(2).

108 (D) Should the number of delegates authorized by the State Board of Directors to attend 109 such International Convention be less than the total number of State Officers, Board of Directors members and District Council Presidents, the State Board Member who is a District Council 110 111 President, shall represent both the Board and their District Council.
