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3	WHEREAS, the American Federation of State, County and Municipal Employees
4	(AFSCME) has launched the Get Organized (GO) program to strengthen union
5	membership, build worker power, and expand collective bargaining rights across the
6	country; and
7	WHEREAS, the Ohio Civil Service Employees Association (OCSEA), AFSCME Loca
8	11, has a long-standing commitment to organizing, member engagement, and the
9	defense of public sector workers' rights; and
10	WHEREAS, the GO program provides critical resources, training, and strategic
11	support to local unions to grow membership and empower workers to advocate for
12	better wages, benefits, and working conditions; and
13	WHEREAS, OCSEA recognizes that organizing is essential to the long-term
14	strength and sustainability of the labor movement, especially in the face of ongoing
15	legislative and judicial challenges to union rights; and
16	WHEREAS, OCSEA leadership, including President Chris Mabe, has publicly
17	supported the AFSCME GO program and emphasized its importance in recent board
18	communications and union publications;

19	THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the delegates of the OCSEA Biennial
20	Convention affirm their full support for the AFSCME GO program and commit to actively
21	participating in organizing efforts across Ohio and beyond; and
22	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that OCSEA will allocate appropriate resources, staff,
23	and training to assist chapters and members in implementing GO program initiatives;
24	and
25	BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED, that OCSEA will work in partnership with AFSCME
26	International and other affiliates to promote the GO program, share best practices, and
27	build a stronger, more inclusive labor movement for all public service workers.

ARTIFICIAL INTELLIGENCE AND THE FUTURE OF WORK

whereas, the Future of Work Committee has already begun evaluating tools such as ChatGPT, Microsoft Copilot, and Synthesia, and exploring training platforms like Brightspace and OpenSesame to ensure OCSEA members are equipped with the knowledge and skills to thrive in a changing workplace; and

WHEREAS, OCSEA recognizes that preparing members for the future of work requires continuous education, awareness, and advocacy to ensure that technological advancements align with union values and protect workers' rights;

1	OCSEA COMMITMENT TO COMMUNICATION AND PUBLIC OUTREACH
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3	WHEREAS, effective communication is essential to building a strong, informed,
4	and engaged union membership, and to promoting the value of public sector work to
5	the broader public; and
6	WHEREAS, OCSEA has developed a robust internal communications
7	infrastructure, including the Member Resource Center (MRC), digital platforms, and
8	outreach campaigns, to keep members informed and connected; and
9	WHEREAS, OCSEA recognizes the importance of educating all Ohioans about the
10	critical role that public sector workers play in maintaining a civil and prosperous society,
11	especially in today's tumultuous political and economic climate; and
12	WHEREAS, OCSEA has implemented targeted media campaigns, developed
13	outreach guides for local chapters, and prioritized member education on political and
14	legislative issues that impact their work and communities; and
15	WHEREAS, the union's communications efforts are supported by dedicated staff
16	and leaders who work to ensure that members receive timely updates, understand the
17	benefits of union membership, and are empowered to advocate for themselves and
18	their coworkers;
19	THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the delegates of the OCSEA Biennial
20	Convention reaffirm the union's commitment to maintaining and strengthening its labor

21	communications network through the continued support of its internal communications
22	department and outreach initiatives; and
23	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that OCSEA will invest in developing members and
24	leaders as communicators and advocates, equipping them with the tools and training
25	necessary to engage their coworkers and the public; and
26	BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED, that OCSEA will continue to expand its outreach to all
27	Ohioans, using every available platform to highlight the importance of public sector
28	work and the essential role unions play in protecting workers' rights and advancing the
29	common good.

of union strength and member protection; and

24	training modules, chapter-level workshops, digital and print materials, and expanded
25	access to the MRC for contract-related inquiries; and
26	BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED, that OCSEA will regularly evaluate the effectiveness
27	of its contract education efforts and adjust strategies to meet the evolving needs of
28	members, ensuring that the full power of the contract is realized in every workplace.
