Prison employees in Toledo unveil billboard regarding prison safety and staffing shortages

Prison staff who are members of the Ohio Civil Service Employees Association (OCSEA) will unveil a billboard on I-280 this week to call attention to the growing violence at Toledo Correctional Institution (TCI) as a result of staffing shortages.

OCSEA union leaders, injured staff and others will hold a press conference on **Wed.**, **Oct. 3 at 11 a.m.** to discuss staffing trends at TCI that have had some alarming consequences for prison and community safety.

Sentencing reform has not caused a significant drop in inmate population, yet Ohio Department of Rehabilitation and Correction policies continue to cut posts and leave positions unfilled, creating unsafe conditions in Ohio's state prisons.
