



Asian & Pacific American Heritage Month

Each May is Asian Pacific American Heritage Month, when we celebrate the accomplishments, culture and history of Asian Americans and Pacific Islanders in the United States. Take a deeper look at members of the Asian American and Pacific Islander community who have advanced the cause of worker justice.



Maf Misbah Uddin Maf Misbah Uddin began work as an actuary in New York City and was president of Accountants, Statisticians and Actuaries Local 1407. He serves as treasurer of AFSCME District Council 37 in NYC. As treasurer, he improved the transparency of the union's finances. He is also founder and president of the Alliance of South Asian American Labor.

May Chen A high school and college teacher and daycare owner, May Chen went on to head the Immigration Project, the first union-created legal advocacy department for immigrant workers. She joined the International Ladies' Garment Workers Union (ILGWU), working in its education department. She served in the Coalition of Labor Union Women and the Asian Pacific American Labor Alliance.





Ai-jen Poo Organizing domestic workers in 1996, Ai-jen Poo helped found Domestic Workers United. In 2010, DWU was key in the passage of New York's Domestic Workers Bill of Rights, the first law in the country to guarantee domestic workers labor protections.

Philip Vera Cruz Born in the Philippines, Philip Vera Cruz worked on farms before moving to the U.S. After joining the Agricultural Workers Organizing Committee, he was a key part of the grape pickers strike in California in 1965. He served as vice president of United Farm Workres until 1977.


